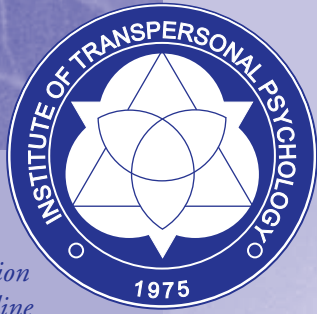

Institute of Transpersonal Psychology: Vision for the Future

TOM POTTERFIELD AND HENRY POON

Dr. Tom Potterfield and Dr. Henry G.C. Poon will introduce the newest vision, mission, and definition of “What Transpersonal Education Is and Can Be” during this Winter Global Seminar session. They will offer sacred guiding principles and methods that have inspired the next generation of transpersonal educators, researchers, and practitioners in learning how to apply world wisdom psychologies towards true Self-development and professional transformation.

THOMAS POTTERFIELD, PH.D., is a published author and a teacher of organizational theories and practices. His written work integrates critical social theory and certain contemporary business practices. He has taught Organizational Leadership at Southern New Hampshire University and has consulted with numerous firms on areas related to organizational development, strategic planning and growth. Tom has extensive corporate experience, serving most recently as President of Velcro USA, Inc. He has had an active spiritual life for many years and practiced transpersonal values in his corporate leadership roles. He was appointed President of the Institute of Transpersonal Psychology in May, 2007.

HENRY G. C. POON, PH.D., M.F.T., is the Chair of the Global Master's Program at ITP and teaches in the Ph.D. program. He is a licensed therapist in California. He has served as a certified clinical psychologist and one of the prestigious researchers at the National Institutes of Health in Japan. His passions include multicultural counseling, world wisdom psychologies, and whole-person education for the gifted and talented. He maintains a clinical and consulting practice.

The Engaged Spiritual Life

DONALD ROTHBERG

A discussion of the deep mutuality between personal spiritual development and action in the world and why individual spiritual transformation and social transformation not only go hand-in-hand, but deeply need each other.

DONALD ROTHBERG, PH.D., is one of the major teachers and writers on socially engaged Buddhism in the United States. He is a meditation teacher on the Spirit Rock Center Teachers Council in northern California and has been an organizer, teacher and board member for the Buddhist Peace Fellowship. He also directs the interfaith Socially Engaged Spirituality program at the Saybrook Graduate School in San Francisco, and is the co-editor of *Ken Wilber in Dialogue: Conversations with Leading Transpersonal Thinkers*.

The Hero's Call

Various cultural myths through time have outlined the “Hero's Journey”, the path toward individuation. In this workshop, we will explore The Hero's Journey motif and how it relates to our personal lives. Through elements of the Person-Centered approach, compassion, empathy and non-judgment, we will work to identify our current life call. In a caring environment using expressive arts—movement, visual arts and writing—we will honor our own heroic journey and embrace the hero within.

MARIA GONZALEZ-BLUE, M.A., is a Registered Expressive Arts Therapist and Registered Expressive Arts Consultant/Educator and has facilitated personal and spiritual growth workshops with diverse populations. Maria served on the faculty of the Person-Centered Expressive Therapy Institute (PCETI), for 14 years. She currently teaches Person-Centered Expressive Arts Therapy at California Institute for Integral Studies, as well as having taught in Mexico, Argentina and Guatemala. Maria served seven years on the Board of Directors of the International Expressive Arts Therapy Association.

The Wounded Researcher: Bridges and Dialogues between Imaginal and Transpersonal Psychology

ROBERT ROMANYSHYN

In this workshop, you will be invited to join in a dialogue about shared concerns and creative differences with contemporaries of transpersonal psychology. Students will engage in a dialogue on how imaginal psychology with its roots in Jung's extended notion of the unconscious shares with transpersonal psychology a common desire to attend to those domains of psychology experience and reality that transcend the personal.

ROBERT D. ROMANYSHYN, PH.D., is a senior core faculty member at Pacifica Graduate Institute. He is also an affiliate member of The Inter-Regional Society of Jungian Analysts for his contributions to the field of Jungian studies. He has authored six books and has contributed chapters to more than 30 edited volumes and published over 50 journal articles. His most recent book is *The Wounded Researcher: Research with Soul In Mind*.

Transforming Education to Transform the World

There are many dimensions involved in transpersonal education. In this workshop, we will explore the transpersonal educational process through whole-person, experiential involvement. How do we learn? What is the focus of our learning? What is a learning community? How might we maximize our engagement in the process? How can we more fully live out ITP's core values? Where is the experience in “experiential learning”? What is the “so what?” of this educational process?

PAUL J. ROY, PH.D., is Academic Vice President at ITP. He has been an Assistant Professor, Director of the Transpersonal Counseling Center, Clinical Training Director, and Residential Dean. He is a licensed psychologist and maintains a small private practice including both psychotherapy and spiritual guidance. Paul's professional interests include transpersonal leadership, peace-making and peace psychology, and the connection between spirituality and psychology.

Gender-balanced, culturally competent, and spirited education: The Women's Panel at 100 Years of Transpersonal Psychology

JUDY SCHAVRIEN

As a member of the opening panel of the 2006 conference, Judy Schavrien will present portions of the panel discussion, comment, and engage the audience on the subject of transpersonal psychology for the 21st century. Such a psychology takes into account unique contributions from a woman's perspective, including embodied and socio-politically engaged approaches; and from Native and African American perspectives.

JUDY SCHAVRIEN, M.F.T., is core faculty in the Global Online Doctoral Program at the Institute of Transpersonal Psychology. Previously at CIIS, she co-founded the first two degrees in the world, Master's and Doctoral, in Women's Spirituality. She is listed in *Who's Who in Medicine and Healthcare, 2006-7* and *Who's Who in American Women*. As a scholar, poet, and artist, editor of the book *What Rhymes with Cancer?*, she has garnered fourteen national and international awards. She's also published several articles in the *Journal of Transpersonal Psychology*.

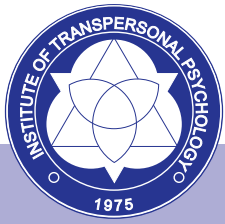
